Message from the President:

Well, I thought that by now I would be able to report to you about our progress on the construction of Phase 1 of the museum project. We've collected enough money to get started, gotten commitments for help and acquired a piece of World Trade Center Steel.

Several months ago, we initiated the process of getting all the permits and permissions necessary to begin construction. So far, we have not received any approvals. All we have learned is that our site may not be suitable for any construction and that it will cost a lot in consulting fees to make presentations to commissions that

It has been a year and a half since we requested a piece of steel from the Port Authority of NY and NJ's WTC artifacts program.

Part of the delay was due to the number of requests for steel that simply overwhelmed the Port Authority.

Our organization was not entirely without blame, as we tried to get approvals from the state of NJ to begin building our memorial.

We would like to thank Kiely Equipment Company for picking up the steel and bringing it to New Jersey, and storing it for us.

We are still hoping to put the WTC steel on interim display while we work on final approvals from the state to build a **permanent Fallen Firefighter's Memorial**.

The Camptown Ladies sing this song, Doo-Da, Doo-Da

So, why is the Fire Museum writing about Camptown? After our last newsletter included an article on Irvington's Silver Ghost parade carriage, a board member was asked: **"Did the Silver Ghost ever belong to Camptown?"** According to Irvington's website, Joseph Camp and his relatives settled into an area that became known as Camp's Town. Then in 1850 Stephen Foster published 'De Camptown Races' and the folks living there did not want their hometown associated with the song.

*The Camptown ladies sing this song, Doo-da, Doo-da
The Camptown racetrack's five miles long
Oh, doo-da day*

Chorus: -----

Goin' to run all night

Goin' to run all day

I bet my money on a bob-tailed nag

Somebody bet on the gray

Oh, the long tailed filly and the big black horse, Doo-da, doo-da

Come to a mud hole and they all cut across, Oh, doo-da day

Chorus

I went down there with my hat caved in, Doo-da, doo-da

I came back home with a pocket full of tin, Oh, doo-da day

(There are many verses, and many versions, you may know others.)

In 1852, Camptown was changed to Irvington, to honor Washington Irving. The paperwork with the carriage is in a folder marked 1854.

And, when the carriage was on display in Sussex County earlier this year, it was inspected and found to be a hose carriage disguised as a parade carriage!

A parade carriage has a drum in place of the hose reel, since they never carried hose. The Silver Ghost has a cover over the reel, making it look like a parade carriage.

So, we've learned the Silver Ghost was never Camptown's, and it's not even a parade carriage!

Now, if I can only get that song out of my head.
