A Year's Worth of Progress!

Its about a year since our lease was signed, giving us office space and a storage building. NJ Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Parks, the NJ Fire Museum, and Monmouth County Park System spent countless hours over many months working together to reach this agreement. Signing the paperwork was the first step toward our goal of opening a museum. We continue to work with NJDEP looking for a suitable location we can open to the public.

Initially we concentrated on readying the site for use. The grounds were overgrown, making the site look unoccupied, and there was some vandalism to the buildings. Around the grounds, a wooden fence was removed, a new chain link fence installed, some crushed stone spread, and much trimming of the shrubbery was completed. Inside the storage building: the walls were pressure washed, the floor was hosed down, one of the overhead doors was repaired, some shelves put up, electrical outlets added, and some of the lights rebuilt. We are continuing our efforts to keep the birds out of the building, and this seems like a never ending project. Hopefully our new Bird Gard will help with this issue.

The office building needed a lot of cleaning, having been unoccupied for several years. The cobwebs were out of control. You couldn't walk





thru the building without hitting several. There were broken windows, the plumbing had several issues: broken fixtures as well as pipes, the heating system needed repairs, and we upgraded the alarm systems. There are still many minor issues to address, such as missing pieces of trim, and we're working on them. The first Saturday of each month (Sept. is 2nd Sat.) we have work parties at the buildings to address these items. If you can lend a hand, we'll find work for you.

Furniture came from several sources. Someone spotted a large desk at a curb with a 'free' sign. Someone else heard about a business moving out of an office building: the business wanted to get rid of file cabinets, chairs, folding chairs, etc. And yet another person brought us several bookcases and other items, including paint. The walls needed that! We now have tables, chairs, a refrigerator, microwave oven, display cases, supplies and too many other items to mention. There are still items we don't have, and they are posted on our website. Look for the *Wish List* page.

During the winter, a board member noticed a support beam was sagging. Upon examination, the structure of the building was deemed inadequate. A structural engineer was hired to determine what was needed, and a construction com-

pany was hired to make the necessary repairs. While making the repairs, they saw that the roof did not meet code. Unfortunately, due to the nature of the repairs, along with a blizzard in the forecast, we could not put the work on hold for the amount of time it would take to receive grant money. All the major repair work is now complete, leaving our treasury quite a bit lighter.

And that was just the buildings! We also moved into them. Our organization has been working out of various homes for a long time. Also, some of the apparatus owned by the non-profit was in a warehouse in NY. Other apparatus was stored various places around NJ. Trucks began moving in as soon as the lease was signed.



Part of the state's collection also moved. In October, over a four day period, the apparatus was moved. The Jersey City water tower was not moved, due to its size. At our membership meeting in May we talked about the effort involved. A thirty minute slide show and speaker are available if you want to schedule a visit. More recently, some large crates were moved. These included part of an alarm system and a huge picture frame with dozens of pictures in it. Smaller items, such as pins, helmets, badges, etc. will be moved at a later date.

What's next? The task of readying the artifacts, as well as getting the motorized trucks running! Everything needs work done: some need cleaning, many need tune-ups, but most need more expensive items, such as tires, before they are road worthy. Anti-freeze, motor oil, spark plugs, brake parts, hoses and wires must be purchased, not to mention gasoline. Fortunately, there are many volunteers providing labor, which keeps our costs down.
